But there's more; the rounders team is paying in a local league too. And it was really satisfying to see so many people using the playing fields and having a drink at The Centre during the early May Bank Holiday. (Don't mention the one just gone).

As well as the fun, Barnwell Court is now really alive: get your hair cut; have lunch; buy tonight's dinner; collect youngest from the nursery. It really is a place to meet and mingle.

True, there is still much to do to get the village ship-shape and as we would all like it, with more facilities. In particular, we continue to have difficulty in providing facilities for young people. In the last newsletter I mentioned our plans to set up a Youth Club, led by a youth worker. Unfortunately, our advert for such a person was not successful so we are still looking. The other route, however, is that any parent who would like to do this would be welcome. The MVA would pay for all the training necessary, and we could get advice and support from the Organisation of County Youth Clubs. If you think this might be for you just give me a call.

I also talked last time about the need for parents of young people to come forward to help re providing facilities on the playing fields. Regrettably none did, so as I made clear last time nothing has happened. This really is unfortunate; I get complaints that the facilities aren't there but no offers to help get them there. Who do you think is going to do it then? Anyway, we have decided to scale down the project in the short term and just concentrate on relocating the basketball hoops that used to be on the field. Come on; it's only a small project - make it happen!

The wind farm proposals: Activity has slowed down a little as it is likely to be some weeks or even months yet before the developers submit the environmental impact assessment (a sophisticated way of saying "yes, we know this ridiculous and outrageous scheme will ruin the lives of many of you, affect the health of many of you and spoil village life for all of you, but here's evidence to say 'not to worry'; and anyway we don't care"). In the meantime the Action Group is working on a public website and continuing to look at the outcomes of wind farm planning appeals across the country to determine the most relevant issues to build our case on.

So, wander round, meet people and take part in things. It's blossom time!

Dear Mawsley Residents,

My original article was going to be of complete good news again: one 'other' crime category; no burglaries; no vehicle crime; no robbery. Linked in with the small number of anti-social behaviour incidents reported, it is very encouraging.

Unfortunately, in the past few days there has been a burglary and there has been vehicle crime.

The burglary was overnight, a house was entered and a set of vehicle keys and mobile phone were taken. The vehicle parked outside was then stolen. During the same night in Mawsley a set of number plates was taken from another vehicle and we are sure the plates were placed on the stolen vehicle to make its escape.

I don't wish to start panic, as for the reporting year 2007/2008 there were NO burglaries of dwellings in Mawsley. This incident does, however, raise the fact that vigilance is always required. I would ask that everyone be aware of their house security - do you have sensor lighting, are your side gates locked and bolted?

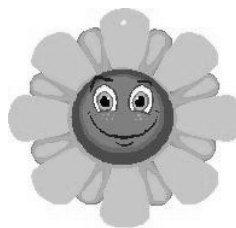

If you have taken on a plot and not returned your signed lease or paid all your fees then please do so by yesterday at the latest.

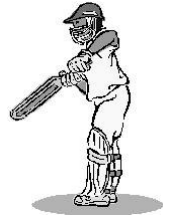

Now that we have been open at The Centre at Mawsley for almost a year we would like to share with you some of the activities we have carried out and some of our achievements over that year. In this time the children have taken part in a wide variety of fun filled activities as part of a variety of topics we have looked at.

We have also taken the children to the Derngate theatre to take part in the mini breaks interactive show that was all about going on holiday. After this show the children were so enthusiastic about the show that we recreated the beach in the hall at The Centre with rock pools full of sea creatures and building sandcastles on the beach. Along with this the children had a walk to Mawsley School to watch the reception classes' Christmas production.

In April Ofsted carried out their inspection on the pre-school and they reported that the care and education of the children is good. Within the report they made some really good comments about the pre-school:
