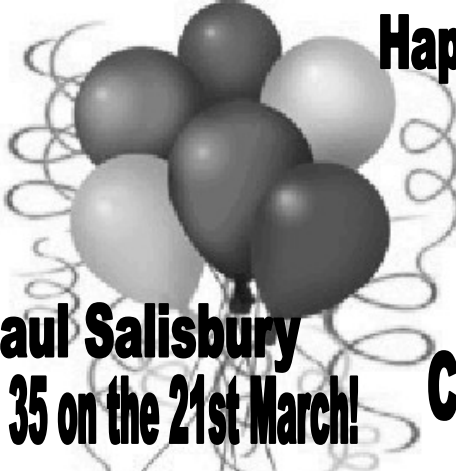
Four Spires Music Festival - A Celebration

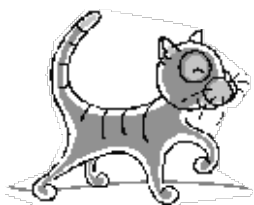

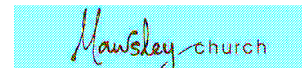

Mawsley Community Primary School

At Mawsley Community Primary School we are always looking to develop our curriculum and provide innovative and interesting ways to extend the children's knowledge and skills. During January and February we introduced eleven Community Projects linking children's interests and adult skills. We were very pleased that a number of parents and friends of the school were able to get involved. It was particularly good to work in conjunction with Mawsley Day Nursery on a project where our children were able to help design a garden area for the young children at the nursery.

Our Community Projects included: car design, marketing, learning about the Netherlands, willow weaving, street dance, art, finance, sewing, film making, orienteering and garden design. The children really enjoyed these sessions and presented their work at an assembly in February. Examples of their work are now on display in the school.

The art group worked on a 3D map of Mawsley. It is hoped that their work will be displayed at The Centre.

Village Pond Conservation

Most villagers will be aware that the pond has been restored to a good standard over the last 12 months with the participation of a number of residents and funding from the Parish Council. We will also see the results of additional bulb planting in the spring.



The pond continues to require regular maintenance and weed clearance, and this is acceptable, however there is evidence that some damage has been done to the trees that surround the area and the habitat log piles have been disturbed and thrown into the water.

It might be coincidental, but since the Mawsley gnomes have moved away, we don't have anyone on permanent guard! On a serious note, the pond is quite deep in parts now and we would request that parents and children are aware of the high water level and pay respect to the conservation of the pond location.

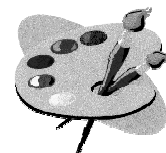

Mawsley School Gardens

A number of our garden plans are starting to take shape in the school grounds!



Copse

The Woodland Trust, through their 'Trees for all' programme, donated thirty trees. These were planted around the edge of our new school pond creating a copse. Bluebells donated by Mrs. Williams were planted under some of the trees and we hope, that with further donations, we will have a blanket of bluebells under the trees each spring. This year the woodland area will be completed with the addition of 15 colourful willow trees. The Garden Club will be planting those this month. The Cordes family, from 'Willows Nursery', is donating the trees. This will be added to the amazing willow structures that they have planted over the past couple of years, which the children have enjoyed playing in.



Wildlife pond

Adjacent to the trees is our school pond. Although built for the past year, it has done a great job at collecting rainwater - but that's it! This year the Bedford Pilgrims Housing Association (BPHA) has stepped in with some fantastic funding. The ECO Club will be laying rocks around the edge and planting bulbs that the ISE Garden Centre have donated to the school. By the end of March our pond plants will arrive and we can start creating a habitat that will encourage some of our wildlife to move in and give the children a great environment in which to study.



Garden club

We have a raised garden already built which will be transformed this spring. We are creating a 'B' garden, which means Birds, Bees and Butterflies! After class 6 became a mad bunch of twitchers during the RSBP bird watch, we decided to create a garden that would encourage the birds to visit and bring in butterflies and bees as well. The club will be creating lavender plants from cuttings and they will be growing seeds for cornflowers and sunflowers along with many other exciting experiments.

The BPHA are also funding the building of other raised gardens for theme based growing and a shed for us to use to store our equipment and use as a space for learning. We collected enough vouchers from Morrisons for some more equipment including propagators and cold frames.



We would like to thank the following people and companies for their generous support of our gardens. Mrs Williams, Willows Nursery, Ise Garden Centre, the Woodland Trust, Rebecca and James Russell (compost bin) and the Bedford Pilgrims Housing Association. We are always on the lookout for any extra help or support. If you have an old wheelbarrow you are getting rid of, large rocks, bulbs, birdhouses, soil, plants or anything else garden related, please think of us.

We hope that by this time next year the school will not only be buzzing with the sound of children but also with plenty of wildlife as well!

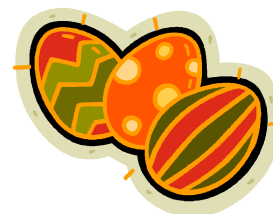

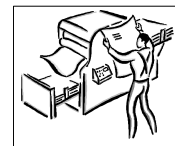
